This deal occurred last week and although most would find it dull/routine I rather enjoyed the layout. I bid 3N (showing 13-15 balanced) in response to my partners 1C opening and West led the 4 hearts. The first hurdle is to play the Q from dummy and hope it holds which it did.

The second hurdle is to recognize that you have 8 sure tricks and that there is a possible extra trick in spades as well as clubs if the suits split three-three or the jack drops. Then there is a possible diamond finesse. So this contract looks very promising.

Seeing all those possibilities, there is one more and that is an end play against West. Watch what happens when you lead the 8 diamonds from dummy and play low from your hand (unless East covers which forces you to play the Queen).

West is now end played in all of the suits. If he leads a black card you get 4 tricks in that suit. If he leads a heart you get your K. If he leads a diamond it is into your tenace for two tricks.

I cannot remember a hand where I was able to end play an opponent at trick two!! Most end plays occur near or at the end of the hand.

As you can see from the actual hand everything possible works no matter what so you can take 4 spades, 1 heart, 2 diamonds by playing to the Q and 4 clubs for a total of 11 tricks.

Ultimately the end play didn't gain anything, just made me feel good to recognize the position. Most everybody made 5, there were a couple of people that made 6 so our result was average.

We use the ACBL textbooks to teach bridge from beginning to intermediate and advanced. All Series are nine weeks long and meet once per week for two hours. The Cost is \$200 which includes the Textbook. Any student wishing to repeat a series can do so for \$100. Attending single sessions for a specific chapter is \$20 per session cost.

The third series on **Defense** began on Monday June 17. 9:30-11:30am and will continue on Mondays through August 19. After a short break we will once again teach the first series, **Bidding in the 21^{st} Century**, meeting from September 9 – November 11.

On Mondays from 1pm - 3pm we are presenting Single Topic Seminars.

These seminar sessions often require some sort of special bid other than a real suit in

competition. It is to your benefit to understand the requirements and also what is given up. These sessions are \$20 per person. As usual we use our large screen monitor (75 inch) to show examples. We work through the subject matter and then segue into example hands for you get to actually hold cards in your hand. These hands are specifically designed to support the lesson. With most of our seminars we actually have a library of subjects with professionally diagnosed descriptions. Most often 18 different hands with written explanations. We are able to send to any class attendee who wishes via an attachment.

Please note that we focus in the beginning on lower-level conventions which occur often. The higher the level of bidding the less often these actually occur at the table so it is to your competitive benefit to learn and UNDERSTAND all of these conventions and treatments over time for when they are used against you during the bidding process.
