## North American Pairs Qualifying Games

Clubs are allowed to hold qualifying games for the grass-roots North American Pairs event starting in June.

You first play at your local clubs, and can qualify for the next level by getting a score of 50% or better. Or, you can qualify by scoring in the top half of your strat.

The strats are: Open (flight A)/2500 (flight B)/under 500/non LM (flight C). Note that if a field has two or fewer pairs, both pairs will qualify.

MP awards will be 50% red and 50% black. Earning a qualification in any club level NAP game in any District qualifies a player for his/her own District NAP finals. No "short game" using fewer than eighteen boards will be considered for NAP qualification.

Check the schedule for the clubs in Unit 499 to see whether they are holding these games and when. The NAP qualifying games can also be held on BBO. Club qualifying games continue from June-August.

West opened 2D, my partner bid 3D, Michaels showing the majors, East bid 3H and alerted that it was an undefined bid in their partnership. I said 3S and my partner raised to 4S.

The opening lead was the 6 of diamonds and I played the 7 from dummy and won East's Q with my Ace. At this point I realized that the heart bid was some kind of shortness and that I needed to cut the opponents transportation so I led the J of diamonds and when West covered with the K of diamonds I discarded the 7 of clubs. This play is called a scissors coup because it eliminates them from being able to put their partner on lead. West now led a heart, I won in dummy and played the K of spades losing to East's Ace, and he led back a club, I trumped in dummy and led a low spade, East won the Queen and led another club which I trumped in dummy and drew the outstanding spade and claimed the balance.

Note that an original heart lead would allow the opponents to get their heart ruff because I wouldn't be able to stop East from putting West on lead. If I led the A and J diamonds, West could play the King and then lead another heart.

Note also that 4H does not make from my side because West can get a spade ruff

#### The Club Course for Beginners Tuesday, May 7-June 25 10am-noon

This course includes hand evaluation, opening 1NT, opening bids and responses, rebids by opener and responder, overcalls, takeout doubles and responses, and basic play concepts. There will be lots of practice hands.

#### The Diamond Course <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 7-June 25 1-3pm</u>

This course focuses on **Play of the Hand.** It includes developing a plan by declarer, counting winners or losers, developing tricks, finessing, eliminating losers, managing the trump suit, considering entries, and avoiding the "dangerous" opponent. There will be lots of practice hands.

#### Rusty Bridge Part IIThurs., May 16-June 20 1-3pm

This course includes weak two bids, 2 club openings and responses, preemptive bids, defining what is and is not a forcing bid, and bidding in the balancing seat. There will be lots of practice hands.

#### Competitive BiddingWed., May 29-June19 1-3pm

This 4-week course covers how to compete using overcalls, takeout doubles or even passing. We will also cover the responses to those competitive bids, and finally, how to respond/handle the competition. Each class will have a one-hour lesson with exercises followed by 4 hands that demonstrate the lesson of the day.

#### Cue BiddingWed., July 10-July 3 11-3pm

This 4-week course will cover the many ways in which we can use Cue bidding to help us better describe our hand: Limit Raise Cue bids, Overcall Cue bids, Western Cue bids, Cue bids showing Controls, and time permitting, we will try to cover "Pick the Suit' Cue bids and Splinter bids.

#### Slam Bidding Wednesday, August 7-August 24 1-3pm

This four-week course covers the many ways to investigate slam contracts using special conventions such as quantitative bidding, Roman Keycard Blackwood/Gerber, Cue bidding controls, Jacoby 2NT, and Splinter bids. We will also define what are the indicators for making slam contracts.

## Lamorinda Bridge Club



Lamorinda Bridge Club (LBC)

We use the ACBL textbooks to teach bridge from beginning to intermediate and advanced. All Series are nine weeks long and meet once per week for two hours. The Cost is \$200 which includes the Textbook. Any student wishing to repeat a series can do so for \$100. Attending single sessions for a specific chapter is \$20 per session cost.

The third series on **Defense** will be taught Mondays June 17 – August 19. 9:30-11:30am. After a short break we will once again teach the first series, **Bidding in the 21**<sup>st</sup> **Century**, meeting from September 9 – November 11.

Please sign up in advance for any classes with Winnie by phone or email or text (see contact information at the end).

On Mondays from 1pm - 3pm we are presenting Single Topic Seminars.

These seminar sessions often require some sort of special bid other than a real suit in

competition. It is to your benefit to understand the requirements and also what is given up. These sessions are \$20 per person. As usual we use our large screen monitor (75 inch) to show examples. We work through the subject matter and then segue into example hands for you get to actually hold cards in your hand. These hands are specifically designed to support the lesson. With most of our seminars we actually have a library of subjects with professionally diagnosed descriptions. Most often 18 different hands with written explanations. We are able to send to any class attendee who wishes via an attachment.

There will be no further afternoon seminar sessions until March 3 as Winnie and I are hosting an ACBL Sectional at Sea aboard the Coral Princess departing January 25 out of San Francisco through the Panama Canal (16 days with 9 sea days) and then returning to Los Angeles (16 days) also through the Panama Canal with different ports of call each direction (only 1 duplicate). Please note that we focus in the beginning on lower-level conventions which occur often. The higher the level of bidding the less often these actually occur at the table so it is to your competitive benefit to learn and UNDERSTAND all of these conventions and treatments over time for when they are used against you during the bidding process.

Jerry will entertain special requests of topics and will reserve the right to alter the above schedule accordingly. We will send out updates on the schedule in coming months to announce possible changes.
