BRIDGE CLASSES with CAROL

At the Orinda Community Center: 925.254.2445 (26 Orinda Way)

The Club Course for Beginners Tuesday, May 7-June 25 10am-noon

This course includes hand evaluation, opening 1NT, opening bids and responses, rebids by opener and responder, overcalls, takeout doubles and responses, and basic play concepts. There will be lots of practice hands.

The Diamond Course Tuesday, May 7-June 25 1-3pm

This course focuses on **Play of the Hand.** It includes developing a plan by declarer, counting winners or losers, developing tricks, finessing, eliminating losers, managing the trump suit, considering entries, and avoiding the "dangerous" opponent. There will be lots of practice hands.

Rusty Bridge Part IIThurs., May 16-June 20 1-3pm

This course includes weak two bids, 2 club openings and responses, preemptive bids, defining what is and is not a forcing bid, and bidding in the balancing seat. There will be lots of practice hands.

Competitive BiddingWed., May 29-June19 1-3pm

This 4-week course covers how to compete using overcalls, takeout doubles or even passing. We will also cover the responses to those competitive bids, and finally, how to respond/handle the competition. Each class will have a one-hour lesson with exercises followed by 4 hands that demonstrate the lesson of the day.

Cue BiddingWed., July 10-July 3 11-3pm

This 4-week course will cover the many ways in which we can use Cue bidding to help us better describe our hand: Limit Raise Cue bids, Overcall Cue bids, Western Cue bids, Cue bids showing Controls, and time permitting, we will try to cover "Pick the Suit' Cue bids and Splinter bids.

Slam Bidding Wednesday, August 7-August 24 1-3pm

This four-week course covers the many ways to investigate slam contracts using special conventions such as quantitative bidding, Roman Keycard Blackwood/Gerber, Cue bidding controls, Jacoby 2NT, and Splinter bids. We will also define what are the indicators for making slam contracts.

South upgraded his hand because of the 5 clubs and this pair got to the nice 6N contract. The opening lead of the J spades was won in dummy with the Ace.

Analyzing this deal, you can see 12 sure tricks if either the club finesse or the diamond finesse loses. Which one would you take?

If you take the club finesse and the J is covered you still need the diamond finesse to make 7. If you take the diamond finesse by leading the Ace and then to the 10 and repeat it to the J if necessary you make 7 if it wins and you still make 6 if it loses so it is clearly best to just take the diamond finesse. Several players took the club finesse and only made 6, while several players took only the diamond finesse and made 7. Being in NT made quite a difference over those in hearts.

Making 1020 was worth 91 % and making 1010 was 70 %, making 990 was 50% and making 980 was 36 %.
