This deal came up in a recent speedball event. Both vulnerable, West opened 1S and it went pass, 2S, 3H, pass 4H, all pass.

This is more of a bidding hand than a play hand. I suspect that most Easts would have offered some type of limit raise because of the 4 spades and the singleton heart. Over 3 spades it is difficult for my hand to bid 4 hearts but easy over 2 spades. I also think that most Wests would have just bid 4 spades instead of pass over both a single raise or a limit raise. Please let me know how you think the bidding should go.

The opening lead was the Q diamonds and you can bet that when they bid and raise a suit, a lead in another suit is shortness (if you have a singleton, lead it).

Given that likelihood, it is right to win the diamond in my hand and start with trumps. East wins the A and leads a diamond and I play low from my hand while West trumps it, I follow low in dummy, a loser I had any way. Notice that if I won the K diamonds in dummy, when East leads a high diamond forcing my A, I would lose another diamond later on. The result of this is that you lose a trick in each suit for down 1, -100. It is clear that they are making 5 spades for 650 so down 1 or 2 would be a good board. As it turns out, -100 is 71%, -200 is 58%, -500 is 51% and -650 is 38%.

Since overall bidding has gotten so aggressive it was quite a surprise to buy the hand in 4 hearts with hardly any opposition.

Rusty Bridge Part II

Thursdays, August 8-August 29

10am-Noon

This course includes weak two bids, 2 club openings and responses, preemptive bids, defining what is and is not a forcing bid, and bidding in the balancing seat. There will be lots of practice hands.

Cue Bidding

Thursdays, August 8-August 29

1-3pm

This 4-week course will cover the many ways in which we can use Cue bidding to help us better describe our hand: Limit Raise Cue bids, Overcall Cue bids, Western Cue bids, Cue bids showing controls, and time permitting, we will try to cover "Pick the Suit" Cue bids and Splinter bids.

The Club Series

Tuesdays, September 3-October 29 10am-Noon

This course is the official ACBL beginner's bridge course on the basics of bidding and play and is also useful for rusty players to update their game. It's an eight to ten-week course that includes hand evaluation, opening 1NT, opening bids, and responses, rebids by opener and responder, overcalls, takeout doubles and responses, and basic play concepts. There will be lots of practice hands.

2/1 Two Over One

Tuesdays, September 3-October 29 1-3pm

This course is a popular variation of the Standard American bidding system This system helps the players to get to the best game contract or explore Slam possibilities at a lower level. I also introduce the response of 1NT as a forcing bidding to improve the partscore contracts. There will be lots of practice hands.

Rusty Bridge Part I

Tuesdays, November 5-December 10 - 10am-Noon

This course is specially designed for those who want to update their bidding skills, improve their communication with their partners, and/or revive their "college days" playing skills. It begins with a thorough basic bidding review, followed by an introduction to preemptive and slam bidding, the Stayman convention, leads against NT vs. Suit Contracts, bidding in the "balancing seat", and the distinction between forcing and non-forcing bids. Each session will consist of 1/2 hour lecture and 1 1/2 hours of supervised play with pre-dealt hands that illustrate the subject of the day. A workbook is available from the instructor at a cost of \$15.

Conventions

Tuesdays, November 5-December 10 - 1

This course covers a selection of bidding conventions including Stayman, Jacoby Transfers, Michaels Cue- Bid, Unusual NT bids, Negative Doubles, New Minor Forcing, Fourth Suit Forcing, 1NT Forcing, plus others. Balancing, third and fourth seat bidding, and other confusing issues, like "reverse" bids, can also be addressed.

Slam Bidding

Wednesdays, August 7-August 24

1-3pm

This 4-week course covers the many ways to investigate slam contracts using special conventions such as quantitative bidding, Roman Keycard Blackwood/Gerber, Cue bidding controls, Jacoby 2NT, and Splinter bids. We will also define what are the indicators for making slam contracts.

Lamorinda Bridge Club (LBC)

We use the ACBL textbooks to teach bridge from beginning to intermediate and advanced. All Series are nine weeks long and meet once per week for two hours. The Cost is \$200 which includes the Textbook. Any student wishing to repeat a series can do so for \$100. Attending single sessions for a specific chapter is \$20 per session cost.

The third series on **Defense** began on Monday June 17. 9:30-11:30am and will continue on Mondays through August 19. After a short break we will once again teach the first series, **Bidding in the 21**st **Century**, meeting from September 9 – November 11.

Please sign up in advance for any classes with Winnie by phone or email or text (see contact information at the end).

On Mondays from 1pm - 3pm we are presenting **Single Topic Seminars.**

These seminar sessions often require some sort of special bid other than a real suit in

competition. It is to your benefit to understand the requirements and also what is given up. These sessions are \$20 per person. As usual we use our large screen monitor (75 inch) to show examples. We work through the subject matter and then segue into example hands for you get to actually hold cards in your hand. These hands are specifically designed to support the lesson. With most of our seminars we actually have a library of subjects with professionally diagnosed descriptions. Most often 18 different hands with written explanations. We are able to send to any class attendee who wishes via an attachment.

There will be no further afternoon seminar sessions until March 3 as Jerry and Winnie are hosting an ACBL Sectional at Sea aboard the Coral Princess departing January 25 out of San Francisco through the Panama Canal (16 days with 9 sea days) and then returning to Los Angeles (16 days) also through the Panama Canal with different ports of call each direction (only 1 duplicate). Please note that we focus in the beginning on lower-level conventions which occur often. The higher the level of bidding the less often these actually occur at the table so it is to your competitive benefit to learn and UNDERSTAND all of these conventions and treatments over time for when they are used against you during the bidding process.

Jerry will entertain special requests of topics and will reserve the right to alter the above schedule accordingly. We will send out updates on the schedule in coming months to announce possible changes.
